

K.L.F.M. RADIO INTERVIEW TRANSCRIPT
PAPER BOAT PROJECT WITH CO-OPERATION OF PALM PAPER
1ST APRIL 2012

1. What gave us the idea? – Looking through a catalogue of Japanese furniture made from paper
2. How will it be constructed? - Traditional Clinker built but using planks made from recycled paper.
3. Why build a paper boat? – to be ecologically friendly by re-using recycled materials
4. When will it be launched? - Today (remembering that the interview will be broadcast on Sunday morning 1st April) at midday from the new slipway at Palm Paper so if people wish to go along to see this unique event they will be most welcome to do so.
5. Suggest that we say that there will be sea trials from its mooring near the South quay in King's Lynn during April and May in the estuary and in the Wash so may be seen off the coast from Heacham and Hunstanton
6. If all goes well its maiden voyage will be at the beginning of June to Canary Wharf from where it will lead the Queen's Jubilee flotilla.
7. A boost to the economy of King's Lynn and a return to its boat building heritage
8. It is then hoped to go into production with various sizes of boat and we are considering entering a yacht for the next America's Cup races.
9. The commodore Peter Harris and Sec Gen Williamson have already arranged to visit the Isle of Wight for Cowes week in August when this boat will be present.
10. We need to ask listeners to phone in with suggestions for a name for the boat incorporating Palm Paper and Anmer Mere.
